# 2025 Hunter Sight-In Days

We will be hosting our annual Hunter Sight-In Days, which are open to the public and of course our members. These will be held on Sundays, November  $2^{nd}$  and  $9^{th}$ . The hours for this annual community event are 9:00 a.m. -3:00 p.m. There are many areas that need to be filled to ensure that we can offer these days for all. Thank you to the many members that have already volunteered! The hours we are needing volunteers for each of these days is approximately 8:00 a.m. until the ranges are cleaned up (about 3:30/4:00 p.m.). We would love to have plenty of volunteers so the shifts can be shorter for all.

Here are some of the areas that we need to fill for each day:

- Early morning set-up,
- Gate Information Volunteer,
- Rifle Safety Inspectors (with tools to inspect the firearms prior to use on the range to ensure all screws are tight, and that they have the right ammunition for their firearm),
- Ranges 1, 2 and 4 Sight-In Helpers/Guides, and
- Tear down at the end of the day.

Volunteers will need to bring eye and ear protection, rifle rests (if they have any), and spotting scopes or good binoculars. We are also looking for some great volunteers willing to help feed our busy helpers.

Items we are looking for are:

- Early morning donuts or rolls
- Soup or easy meals at lunchtime (Soups have been covered this year thanks to members and volunteers Dave Miller and Paul Jensen!)
- Cookies or small desserts
- Individual Chip Bags (Thank you to member and volunteer Curtis Evans for providing these for our volunteers!)
- Bottled water (the coffee, cups, plates, paper towels, napkins, and silverware will be taken care of) In recent years, we have helped between 220 to over 300 people get sighted in. # Rifle/Pistol Members Sighting In Reminders

As we have many members (and guests with the members) that are getting ready for this fall hunting season and beyond, it is imperative to remind all of our Rifle/Pistol members and their guests of these important reminders:

- If you are sighting in ANY NEW EQUIPMENT, make sure you start on Range 1 at the 25-yard lanes to make sure that you are dialed in at that distance. Any new equipment includes guns, scopes, etc. Once you are good there, then you can move over to the 100-yard Range 2. This is a requirement to make sure we maintain the highest safety standards as well as prevent any property damage.
- On the Rifle/Pistol Ranges, make sure you complete a guest pass and pay the \$10 guest pass fee for any guest that you bring BEFORE ENTERING THE RANGES. If you are a Rifle/Pistol member, you may bring your spouse and your children under the age of 25 and any other youth through the age of 19 without a guest pass. The member MUST stay with their guests and always supervise them. No lending out your cards. A Family membership DOES NOT mean that the children of the two designated members can come out without one of the designated members. We have cameras now that are recording all areas. Any member that is caught on the range with an unpaid guest or guests will be required to pay a \$50 fine per guest plus the \$10 guest pass fee per guest. Please don't risk the loss of your membership for a fee that is well below other area shooting ranges fees!

# Lincoln Ikes Membership Chairman Position Opening

We are looking for a great volunteer that would be interested in being our Lincoln Ikes Membership Chairman. A huge thank you Wes Sheets for the many, many years of service in this position. He has stepped down from this position and we are looking for someone that would be a good fit. To help explain this position, here are some of the general pointers (see below). If this sounds like something that you might be interested in, please email us at <a href="ikes.lincoln@gmail.com">ikes.lincoln@gmail.com</a>. Thank you for considering!

- Work with individuals at our National Izaak Walton League Office, the State Ike's and our Managers to make sure all our memberships are processed accordingly and if there are any updates with each.
- Whenever we know that any current members have moved or have passed away, we need to let the National Office know so that they can discontinue to send items
- Work with any prospective new members through email, phone or in person with answering any questions that they might have and getting them registered for orientation sessions if needed.
- Provide an updated report to our Board and/or Board President for our monthly Board of Directors meetings. Items on this
  report have included the following in recent years: Current number of all members, rifle/pistol members, trap members,
  new and renewing members for this year. Wes and/or the Managers would also provide numbers of members at the current
  time of year for previous years also so we could compare to where we currently are to previous years as well.
- Help with the planning of at least two monthly membership orientation sessions with the Facilities Managers.
- Work with the Managers to let them know the list of prospective new members. This way, they can get the range cards, gate cards and/or *LongRange* trap cards programmed and ready for the orientation sessions.
- In April or May, meet with the necessary committee(s)/people to propose the membership dues structure for the following year. In May, present to the board and they will vote on the increase, decrease, etc. After this meeting, the Managers will prepare new applications to be posted on the website and in the clubhouse, etc.
- Usually beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>, the National Ikes will begin to accept new memberships as either: 1) for the rest of this current year, or 2) new members also have the option of paying a little more for memberships through the current year and the following year.
- In August, the Membership Chairman sends a letter to the National Izaak Walton League's Director of Member Programs, regarding what our membership dues are
- In August, the memberships list needs to be verified with the list at the national office so we can verify that the renewal forms from the National Ikes office are as correct and accurate as possible. From there, the Membership Chair can contact the National Office to let them know that we are ready for them to print the upcoming year's renewal documents for each current member.
- At the October monthly board meeting, we usually ask the board members to meet a couple of hours beforehand to prepare the envelopes to be mailed out to our current membership for their next year's membership renewals. Before this meeting, the Membership Chairman usually gathers all the supplies to make sure everything is available for this work meeting, including gathering the right number of applications for each membership group (Regular/Individual, Family, Student or Life memberships), postage stamps, returned address stamps, and a letter from the Membership Chairman to each member. This letter goes over some of the basic information on how members can renew (online or via mail), other important information with the club coming up. After the meeting, the Membership Chairman takes the boxes of sealed and stamped envelopes to the post office to be mailed out around mid- to late-October.
- Usually in November, the National Ikes will begin to accept new memberships to include the remaining of the current year and then all following year. Therefore, we can begin to process these memberships after November 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **Some Basic Membership Information:**

• All our members are also members of our National Izaak Walton League and our state Izaak Walton League. Part of the membership fees for each member are paid to the National Office and they in turn pay a portion to our State Ikes.

- Members then have options of which ranges they would like to have access to and be a member to: rifle/pistol, trap/shotgun, both, or either of these. Members without the rifle/pistol or trap/shotgun ranges still have access to the archery range, youth catch-and-release pond, walking trail around the CRP ground and they also have voting privileges for our new or re-running board members in July. Our board members must be members for at least the last two consecutive years to run for a board position. Any member can attend one of our monthly board meetings, which are held on the second Tuesday of each month, beginning at 7:15 p.m. in the clubhouse.
- All new members must complete an orientation session for whatever ranges that they would like to join to have access to. Some members start out with just one range and then later want to add the other range(s) to their membership. To do this, they will need to complete the application, pay the updated range dues and any necessary deposits (gate card and/or <code>LongRange</code> trap card), and also attend one of our orientation sessions before having access to the new range(s).
- Our memberships are for a calendar year from January 1<sup>st</sup> (or beginning whenever the renewing member renews that year) through December 31<sup>st</sup>. Renewing members must renew for that current year before having access to the ranges, etc.
- Working with the board each spring to establish the membership and range dues for the next year. After June 15<sup>th</sup>, we offer NEW MEMBERS ONLY a Year + Membership (this includes a membership for the rest of the current year plus all the following year) or they can have the usual membership through the end of the current year.

# 2025 Summer Trap League Results

The Summer Trap League's final night was held on August 21, with 30 teams divided into five different classes (AA through D) based on their shooting abilities. The classes are based on the previous year's scores and the first two weeks of shooting. Sometimes that works and sometimes it doesn't.

Now on to the season results, which are listed below. Awards are presented to the top three teams in each class. During the season, teams shoot against a different team in their class each week, with a point awarded for the team who has the highest score for 16-yard, handicap and total score for a maximum of three points for each night. If there is a tie between teams at the end of the season, the tie breaker is the total number of targets broken over the 15-week season. Awards are also presented to the overall top shooter, along with the top shooter in each class. They need to have shot a minimum of seven rounds of each 16-yard and handicap for their score to qualify. The winners were announced at the end of the season party. Just to say, the scores were very close. It is always great to see shooters enjoying themselves and the great conversation between teams on trap night.

In order for a league to run smoothly, we need great help. Special thanks to Kay and Bev for their great work in the office, and J.J. and the rest of the bartenders for running the bar on the hot nights to cool you down and to wash down the great food provided by Skymart. Thanks to Dylan Broughton for organizing the workers every night, which is not an easy task with everyone's busy schedules. The end of the season's party is scheduled for Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, with the bar open at 6:00 and food ready around 6:30. Awards will be handed out, along with some raffle prizes.
