2024 Hunter Sight-In Days

We will be hosting our three annual Hunter Sight-In Days, which are open to the public. These will be held on Sundays, November 3^{rd} and 10^{th} . The hours for this annual community event are 9:00 a.m. -3:00 p.m. There are many areas that need to be filled to ensure that we can offer these days for all. The hours we are needing volunteers for each of these days is approximately 8:00 a.m. until the ranges are cleaned up (about 3:30/4:00 p.m). We would love to have plenty of volunteers so the shifts can be shorter for all.

Here are some of the areas that we need to fill for each day:

- Early morning set-up,
- Gate Information Volunteer,
- Rifle Safety Inspectors (with tools to inspect the firearms prior to use on the range to ensure all screws are tight, and that they have the right ammunition for their firearm),
- Ranges 1, 2 and 4 Sight-In Helpers/Guides, and
- Tear down at the end of the day. Volunteers will need to bring eye and ear protection, rifle rests (if they have any), and spotting scopes or good binoculars. We are also looking for some great volunteers willing to help feed our busy helpers.

2024 Summer Trap League

The Summer Trap League's final night was held on August 22nd with 34 teams divided into 5 different classes (AA through D) based on their shooting abilities. The class is based on the previous year's scores and the first two weeks of shooting. Sometimes that works, and sometimes it doesn't.

Now on to the season results (which are listed below). Awards are presented to the top three teams in each class. During the season, teams shoot against a different team in their class each week, with a point awarded for the team who has the highest score for 16-yard, handicap and total score, for a maximum of 3 points for each night. If there is a tie between teams at the end of the season, the tie-breaker is the total number of targets broken over the 15-week season. Awards are also presented to the overall top shooter, along with the top shooter in each class. They need to have shot a minimum of 7 rounds of each 16-yard plus their handicap, for their score to qualify. The winners will be announced at the end of the season party. The scores were very close!

In order for a league to run smoothly, we need great help. Special thanks to Kay and Bev for their great work in the office, and to J.J. and Dallas for running the bar on the hot nights to cool you down and to wash down the great food provided by Skymart Mobile. Thanks to Toby Jordan and Dylan for organizing the workers every night, which is not an easy task with everyone's busy schedule. Also, I would like to thank Craig Keaschall, Aaron Lyons, Danny Wright, Jeff Krinke and Mike Moore for help while I was laid up with an injury. The end of the season's party is scheduled for Sept. 24th, with the bar open at 6:00 and food ready around 6:30. Awards will be handed out, along with some raffle prizes.

Robert "Gus" J. Fredrickson

December 22, 1930 - August 2, 2024

Robert "Gus" J Fredrickson, age 93, of Roca, Nebraska, previously of Lincoln, passed away on Friday, August 2, 2024. Gus was born December 22, 1930, to Robert O. and Edna Heller Fredrickson in Lincoln.

Gus's son, Karl Fredrickson, has this to say about his father's involvement with Ikes: "Dad (Gus to most everyone) was a long time member of the Lincoln Ike's working on many project over the years, dragging me along (fun) from building the 'new' clubhouse, planting pine trees, shooting trap (SCS), rifle shooting, sight-in days, making signs and announcement kiosks, and many others."

He attended elementary school and junior high in Lincoln plus one year at Lincoln High School. His family then moved to farms near Gresham, Nebraska, where he completed high school. After graduation, he moved back to



Lincoln to work for International Harvester and then joined the US Army to serve during the Korean War. He was stationed in Yokohama, Japan, where he repaired radar sets. While flying home in 1953, a fellow soldier encouraged him to earn a college degree, and he took to that idea. With the help of the GI Bill and work-study jobs, he first attended Doane College in Crete, Nebraska, and then the University of Nebraska in Lincoln to complete his civil engineering degree. He then spent his entire career with the USDA Soil Conservation Service, involved in the designing and constructing of earthen flood control dams on many watersheds in Nebraska.

At Doane, he met fellow student Jane Herzog, who was studying to become a teacher, and they were married in Omaha at Florence Presbyterian Church on June 20, 1959. Daughter Linnea was born in Lincoln and son Karl in Beatrice.

In addition to being a professional engineer, Gus was also a woodworker who made everything from turned bowls, plates, and lamps to headboards, bedroom sets, side tables, cradles, and benches as well as beautiful black walnut gunstocks. With his many skills, he was able to help family, friends, and neighbors with home and machinery repairs and maintenance of all sorts, and he really enjoyed doing this. All his life, he loved to hunt (especially deer), fish (especially big northern pike), garden (vegetables),



watch the weather, and just be outdoors. He and Jane lived many years on acreages frequented by wild birds, deer, and other wildlife. Summertime for many years meant a trip to northern Minnesota, either to a lake cabin or for a canoe trip with family and friends in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and Ontario's Quetico Provincial Park. Recently, he shared stories with a chaplain, who said, "Gus, it sounds like you've had a pretty good life." He smiled and agreed: "Yes, I have."

Gus is survived by his wife of 65 years, Jane Fredrickson, children Linnea Fredrickson and Karl (Lou) Fredrickson, grandchildren Melanie (Jeff) Mueller and Stephanie (Mike) Bradley, and greatgrandchildren Logan, Gabby, Kaiden, and Alexis, and many other relatives and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents and sister Joan Nienkamp.


