Rifle/Pistol Work Day on September 6th

New Ground Baffle on Rifle Range 2

On July 26^{th} , an Eagle Scout Project was completed on Range 2 by Scout Jacob Klein. This is a ground baffle that is removable by lane to allow prone shooting if needed (simply remove the 2 x 6 in your lanes if needed and then replace them before you leave). The purpose of this is to prevent any issues with ground skips.

The baffle is not to hang or place targets on and there will be consequences for anyone that does this. Do not shoot the baffle or use it for targets or to place swingers in front of. It is a safety improvement for additional bullet retention that is not to be shot on purpose or to be used for a backstop for short range shooting on Range 2. This range remains a 100-yard Range and no other distances are allowed to be shot on Range 2 during normal shooting by members. Thank you for helping to keep our ranges safe and undamaged.



2025 Hunter Sight-In Days

We will be hosting our annual Hunter Sight-In Days, which are open to the public. These will be held on Sundays, November 2^{nd} and 9^{th} . The hours for this annual community event are 9:00 a.m. -3:00 p.m. There are many roles that need to be filled to ensure that we can offer these days for all. The hours we are needing volunteers for each of these days is approximately 8:15 a.m. until the ranges are cleaned up (about 3:30 p.m). We would love to have plenty of volunteers so the shifts can be shorter for all.

Here are some of the roles that we need to fill for each day:

2025 Trap Range Lead Mining Information

Some members have asked about the lead mining that went on this last spring/summer. In May and June. Gipson Ricketts mined our lead into 78 containers totaling 234,907 lbs. which were reclaimed. The last time they mined the lead was in 2020. They typically try to mine every five years and this is based off of the number of trap targets thrown over the period between minings.

Below is a summary of Gipson Ricketts and their process.

Gipson-Ricketts Lead Reclamation Summary

Gipson-Ricketts LLC specializes in lead recovery services for gun clubs and shooting ranges across the U.S., using a dry reclamation method that involves high-frequency screens to separate lead from soil and other materials. Here is a concise overview of their process and capabilities:

Reclamation Process

- Initial Steps: They begin by removing the topsoil and storing it in tarp-covered piles outside the shot fall area.
- Screening: The dry material is screened to extract lead, using equipment like soil screening plants and separating trommels.
- Tailings Management: After lead extraction, the remaining material (tailings) is spread back over the shot fall area, leaving it smooth and naturally contoured.
- Weather Resilience: Their dry method minimizes delays due to wet weather, allowing quick resumption of work.

Operational Flexibility

- They can work day or night, allowing shooting activities to continue during the project.
- Their schedule is tailored to the club's needs.
