Please note that the membership dues for 2024 are as follows for REGULAR members (for family, student, and life members, please see your renewal notices for your membership dues total or call our office for these different amounts): \$195 for rifle & pistol range access, \$170 for trap range access, or \$235 for all ranges (rifle/pistol and trap). As always, our memberships run for the full 2024 calendar year (January 1st - December 31st), *starting when you renew*.

Have you added a new range to your 2024 Membership?

Some of you have added a new range to your 2024 membership (for example, you have been a rifle/pistol member and have now added the trap range to your membership; or vice versa, a trap member, but have added the rifle/pistol ranges to your membership). Before you can have access to these new ranges that you have added, you will need to attend one of our orientation sessions. With the trap range, new members will also need the *LongRange* trap card. This requires a one-time \$20 deposit on the card as well. We have some orientations scheduled each month so if you are interested, please contact our office and we can provide you with that information.

Missouri River Cleanup—Can We Do More?

You may have heard the tidbit that Nebraska has the most miles of rivers and streams out of all of the U.S. states. Well, as it turns out, that's not quite true—Alaska and Texas both have more than double what we do. But Nebraska still features a whopping nearly 80 thousand miles of river. That's a lot of water for a state that's about 430 miles across.

Even if we're not #1, the fact that this bit of information gets passed around shows how proud Nebraskans are of our waterways. It's easy to understand why: between our gorgeous rivers and streams and the Ogallala Aquifer, our water resources are one of our more remarkable features. It's what led us to become a world leader in irrigation and agriculture.

Unfortunately, not everyone appreciates our wonderful waterways, and a lot of trash and debris can accumulate in these rivers. More than just being an eyesore, this junk can contaminate our water supply and cause illness in both humans and animals. It can also contribute to flooding by restricting water channels, and those floods can ruin farmland and render homes unfit to live in for years afterward.

January's Missouri River Initiative newsletter featured a story about speaking to schoolchildren in South Dakota about the Missouri River and encouraging them take part in volunteer cleanups. That brought to mind a question: what could we do here in Nebraska to help support the health of our waterways?

Maybe we should start a volunteer cleanup group of our own—we might be able to partner with the Wild Turkey Federation or other groups. Maybe we can start talking to kids about the importance of our rivers here in Nebraska, too. There are many possibilities.

Nebraska's rivers are part of what makes this state so special. Not only are they beautiful to look at, they provide drinking water to millions of people—not to mention being an important habitat for fish and wildlife. I feel we should think long and hard about how we protect these precious resources. If you have any thoughts or suggestions, please, let us know.

2024 SUMMER TRAP LEAGUE

Teams can submit their rosters by either email or USPS (no team meeting). Sponsor fees can be paid at that time or the first night of league. Please provide me your team's name two weeks prior to the first night of league. The first night of shooting is scheduled to begin on May 9th and the Summer League is schedule to end on August 22nd, thus a 15-week season (rain out makeup date on August 29th if needed). The Fall League is scheduled to run from September 5th through October 24th, thus a season of 8 weeks. Currently the sponsor fees will remain at \$85 per team for the Summer League and \$40 for the Fall League as well as the cost per round of \$8. Teams that are entirely youth shooters will be charged \$50 and \$25 respectively.

During the Summer Trap League season, shooting typically starts at 6:30 p.m. and ends around 9:00-9:30 p.m. on Thursday nights. The team that shoots at 6:30 p.m. one week will shoot at 7:00 p.m. the next week. Only the team members on the roster are allowed to shoot. Scores the first two weeks of the Summer League along with team's shooting ability in the past will be used to classify. (AAA, AA, A, B, etc.) The first round will be from the 16-yard line and based on the team score, a handicap yardage will be assigned. Teams will be assigned on who they are competing against which will change every week.

One point will be assigned for the 16-yard, handicap and overall scores for a potential total of 3 points. All ties will split the point - giving both teams ½ the point. Team members need to have a minimum of one round of 16-yard targets and one round of handicaps during the first two weeks of qualifications. The Fall League will use the Lewis system to establish points with teams shooting at the same time each week.
