Ikes National Convention to Be Held in Lincoln!

The Izaak Walton League national convention will be held Thursday July 27 – Saturday July 29, with Early Bird Wednesday, July 26 beginning at 7 p.m. – this is a later start time than usual because the hotel has multiple other large events on the same day and cannot make a room available for us until 7 p.m. The Executive Board and IWLA Endowment Board meet Wednesday.

Register for the Convention: Visit the national website to register for the convention. Using the online option, you can select meal functions, register young people for the youth convention or add guests to special events, such as the Early Bird welcome reception.



If you prefer to register using a paper form, you can print the form included in the convention kit and mail it to the Nebraska Division with your payment.

Register Young Ikes for the Youth Convention: From touring the Strategic Air Command museum to hands-on conservation projects around Lincoln, Nebraska, the youth convention offers three days of fun, educational experiences and time outdoors for young Ikes ages 8 to 18. Parents and grandparents can register youth through the <u>national website</u> or using the paper registration form included in the printed convention kit. **Registration for the youth convention is open through July 1, 2023**.

Policy Resolutions Available for Chapter Review: Committees consisting of League members met in April to consider and vote on policy resolutions proposed by chapters, divisions and members. The resolutions for convention are posted on the <u>national website</u>. These are **proposals only** – resolutions do not become League policy unless they are adopted by delegates at the convention. **Voting at convention is in person.**

Lincoln Ikes Chapter Leadership Elections

It is just about time for board elections! Every year, we have four (4) of our board of directors' positions come up for election or re-election to a three-year term. If you or another member you know would like to run, the requirements and expectations of our board of directors' members are as follows:

QUALIFICATIONS FOR THOSE TO BE ELECTED TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

- Must be an active advocate and paid current year member
- Must be a current member for at least the last two consecutive years (i.e. cannot run for board until completing at least two (2) full years as a member.)
- Expected to attend monthly board of directors' meetings, which are generally held the second Tuesday of each month in our clubhouse beginning 7:15 p.m.

QUALITIES TO LOOK FOR IN A BOARD OF DIRECTOR MEMBER:

- A current member who is an active and vibrant participant of our Lincoln Izaak Walton League and with the values our organization holds
- Someone with a sense of vision to help with the betterment of our Lincoln Ikes as a whole
- Someone with creativity and energy, and willing to give of their talents for our Lincoln Ikes
- A willingness to listen to other member's viewpoints, collaborate and compromise
- The ability and the desire to work with other Board members and current members as a team for the progress of our Lincoln Ikes, keeping safety as the upmost priority

OTHER BOARD OF DIRECTORS INFORMATION

- The property, affairs, activities, and concerns of the Lincoln Chapter shall be vested in a Board of Directors consisting of thirteen (13) Directors.
- The new members of the Board shall assume the performance of their duties, on September 1st of each year, and shall continue in office until their successors shall be duly elected and qualified.
- New members shall, however, attend the August Board meeting to adequately provide for a smooth transition, and to vote for the newly elected officers for the following year.
- New members elected in July of each year may vote only for new officers during the August board meeting.
- Outgoing members of the board shall retain full voting rights until September 1st except for voting on new officers.
- Special meetings of the board of directors may be called by, or at the request of, the president or any two directors.
- <u>Items that are covered during the monthly meetings: Guest Introductions/Presentations, approval of previous meeting's minutes from the secretary, Treasurer's Report, Membership Report, Manager's Reports, Groundskeeper Reports, Committee Reports (Rifle/Pistol Committee Meeting, Archery Committee, Safety & Rules Committee, and Trap Committee), Match Directors Reports, New Business, and Unfinished/Tabled Business.</u>

Current members can email or send their ballots by mail, or wait and hand them in when attending the annual all-members meeting and dinner in the Lincoln Ikes clubhouse on Monday, July 24th at 6:00 p.m. (ONE BALLOT PER REGULAR, STUDENT AND LIFE MEMBER; TWO BALLOTS FOR FAMILY MEMBERSHIPS.) But, before you submit your ballot and decide on your vote, be sure to review the essays each of the candidates have sent in. It is important to know more about who our leaders are and what experiences and skills they bring to the jobs they do for Lincoln Ikes. We thank all of those that have served, are running for re-election and any new candidates! Please see the June and July newsletter for the ballots and cast your vote!

Mike Streeter:

I spent most of my childhood in Rapid City, South Dakota (ages 5 through 14). I moved to Omaha in 1963 and graduated high school in Omaha (Westside High class of 1967). I enrolled in junior college in Norfolk, Nebraska, but found working and making money a better deal and more fun than attending school. So, I kind of forgot to attend school. OOPS. After one semester in December 1967, I received a letter from the draft board in Omaha that said "Greetings from the President of the United States." I had a choice of reporting for duty with the U.S. Army or US Marine Corps, so I followed my father's example and enlisted in the US Navy in January, 1968. I served in the U.S. Navy until March 1972. I attended the rank of Gunners Mate second class and did two tours of duty in Vietnam while aboard a Destroyer Escort out of San Diego, California.

Voting Information

Ballot used to cast your vote is the same regardless of how you submit it. The goal of the board is to provide every member with the opportunity to vote. To that end, the board has approved the following three methods:

1. Electronic Ballot

Complete the member information section of the ballot. Then, enter your vote for the candidate(s) of your choice. When your ballot is complete, forward your ballot to: <u>ikes.lincoln@gmail.com</u>. A confirmation email will be sent back to you confirming that we received it.

2. Paper Ballot by Mail

Complete the member information section of the ballot. Then, enter your vote for the candidate(s) of your choice. Mail your completed ballot to: Election Committee

3. Paper Ballot in Person

Members who wish to attend the Annual Meeting, which we strongly encourage, can cast their ballot in person. You will be given a ballot to cast your vote for board seats and will be required to complete the member information section of the ballot, then select your vote for the candidate(s) of your choice.

The election committee will be the only people that will view your ballot. The election committee will check all ballots against the current membership roster.

Your vote will remain secret.

The election committee will only use it to check against the current membership roster to make sure that you only vote once. After the election results have been approved, all ballots will be destroyed and all emails deleted.

Walk-in ballots must be received by the start of the annual board meeting. Electronic and Mail in ballots must be received no later than:

New Addition at Garber Lake

On Saturday, June 4th, with the support of Neil Lunzmann, Andrew Shields of Troop 32 Lincoln NE, installed fish habitat in Garber Lake for his Eagle Scout project. The artificial Christmas trees were created by repurposing polyethene tubing from irrigation systems donated by the following Reinke Irrigation businesses:

- Reinke Manufacturing Co. Inc. Deshler, NE
- Carlson Irrigation Shickley, NE
- South Central Irrigation Deshler, NE

In the weeks leading up to the installation, Andrew and his father Michael Shields, with the help of others, cut the trunks to size and drilled the holes for the limbs of the trees. With a little trial and error, the best method was determined and helped the installation go smoothly. If all goes correctly the trees should be about 15" below water level when the pond is at capacity.

On June 4th, members of Troop 32 placed the trunks into pre-dug holes on the lakes bottom and installed the limbs to complete the fish habitat. This should create a safe haven for smaller fish which in turn will attract larger fish to the area.

A BIG thank-you to Neil Lunzmann for all his work and volunteering MANY hours to assist with this project.
